Please check with your favorite librarian to find out if your university library has this service. OCLC numbers and ISBN numbers, when available, have been provided to help with this process. Most, if not all of the items in this bibliography are available via interlibrary loan, and these numbers will also help when included with interlibrary loan requests. (Your favorite librarian from your university or local public library will thank you for the extra information.) In spite of all the technological marvels from the last twenty years that makes research somewhat less burdensome, please never forget that your very best resource in your research is a librarian, and that not everything is digitized.

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
