In the next part, there is a list of pupils of the chapel. It appears that the total number of pupils ranged from 2 to 14. Adult musicians and pupils played various instruments: harpsichord ("klawicymbaly"), clavichord ("klawikort"), organ, violin, alto, viola da gamba ("kwartviola"), cello ("basetla"), oboe, bassoon, trumpet, and horn; there were singers as well."
